INVITATION FOR NOMINATIONS

Invitation by the MEC responsible for Human Settlements for nominations of persons in terms of section 7(4) of the Housing Act, 1997 as amended, for appointment as members of the North West Housing Advisory Panel to advise the MEC on any matter relating to housing development

In terms of the Housing Amendment Act, No 04 of 2001, D. Mohono, Member of the Executive Council responsible for Human Settlements in the North West Province, hereby calls for nominations of persons to serve on the North West Housing Advisory Panel.

The Panel must comprise of a combination of expertise, skills and knowledge in the following fields:

- Theoretical and/or practical knowledge in housing policy development
- Extensive knowledge of low-income housing finance
- Knowledge of the built environment fields, such as Engineering, Regional and Town Planning.
- Experience in and knowledge of low-income housing related legislation
- Practical experience in project management, implementation and contract administration
- Knowledge and/or experience in respect of planning legislation and planning strategy and policy
- Mobilization and organizational skills.

The competencies of the nominated persons should be clearly reflected on their Curriculum Vitae.

The following provisions in the Act have a bearing on the appointment of members of the Housing Advisory panel. The MEC must establish a panel of not more than 6 persons who are fit and proper, possess knowledge, qualifications or experience in the field of housing. Members of the panel will be appointed in accordance with procurement policies consistent with section 217 of the Constitution Act 108 of 1996, and must be appointed only after the MEC has through the media and by notice in Gazette invited nominations of persons as candidates for the respective positions in the panel. A member of the panel shall be appointed for a period determined by the MEC, and may, subject to subsection (3) be reappointed on termination of that period. The MEC may at any time terminate the membership of the panel member for

reasons that are just and fair. A member of the panel other than the person who is in full-time employment of the State, will be paid an allowance determined by the MEC with the approval of the MEC responsible for Treasury in the province.

A member of the panel ceases to be a member if:

- He/She resigns
- His/her estate is sequestrated or he/she applies for assistance in terms of section 10(1) (e) of the Agricultural Credit Act of 1996.
- He/She becomes of unsound mind
- He/She is convicted of an offence and sentenced to imprisonment without an option of a fine
- He/She becomes a member of Parliament, Provincial Legislature, a Municipal Council, the Executive Council of a Province.

Applications must be accompanied by the following documents;

- Identity Document, Certified copies of qualifications; A CV with competencies, experience and full names; addresses and telephone numbers of at least three referees; Applicants with foreign qualifications must submit a SAQA evaluation report on the qualification. Failure to comply with the above requirements will result in the immediate disqualification of an application.
